
GK & FS Training at KC State Convention Get Registered!



I look forward to seeing each and every one of you at the 2016 State Convention in St. Cloud on May 13-15.







May has always held a special significance for me, *Mayday* the first day of that month, being my birthday. My school pals used to tease me that Mayday parades held in the Soviet Union at the time were to celebrate the fact that I was not born there!

May is celebrated as a spring festival, and there was a tradition in England of *bringing in the may*, in which people would gather greenery and flowers in the woods, described in this 16th century poem by (some say) Chaucer:

And furth goth all the Court, both most and lest,
To feche the floures fressh,
and braunche and blome;

And namly, hawthorn brought both page and grome. With fressh garlandes, partie blewe and whyte,

And thaim rejoysen in their greet delyt. (If you need help figuring out the *Olde English*, drop me a line)

This fresh greenery and blossoms would be used to decorate the Maypole, another English tradition. Celebrants danced around the pole, holding ribbons which they wove in and out to form a braid. Greenery and flowers would also be used to make garlands to crown the *May Queen*.

Of course May is traditionally the month of the Virgin Mary, and Catholic schools will often have a May Crowning of a statue of Mary. Devotion of May to Mary is a fairly recent tradition, which appears to have started at a Jesuit college in Rome in the late 18th century.

Don't forget that May also contains that very important holiday for those of us who wish to remain happily married – Mother's Day! Vivat Jesus!
