# of the **Marathon**

The first MARATHON for Nonpublic Education originated in the Twin Cities when over 1200 participants collected about \$2500. It was so successful that the Twin Cities Federation of Home & School Associations declared the MARATHON an annual event. and the Minnesota MARATHON for Nonpublic Education, Inc., was formed. To date the MARATHON has generated nearly \$100 million for Nonpublic Education!

## **KC's Adopt Marathon**

In recognition of the MARATHON's contribution to nonpublic education, the Minnesota Catholic Conference and the State Council of the Knights of Columbus (with more than 274 councils and over 43,000 members) have endorsed the MARATHON and the Knights of Columbus have renewed their financial commitment to help defray expenses.

### **Annual Marathon**

The Minnesota MARATHON for Nonpublic Education, Inc., has set the first Saturday of October as the official date for the statewide annual MARATHON, Instructions, donation sheets, posters and details are furnished to any nonpublic educational institution that wants to participate in the MARATHON and has properly registered with the resource.

## **Minnesota Marathon** for Nonpublic Education

The MARATHON is a viable public relations and fundraising activity in support of nonpublic education. Participants obtain donations from sponsors and then walk, run, jog or bike a prescribed local MARATHON route or perform a service project. All monies collected are given directly to the participants for the nonpublic educational activity of his or her choice.



## **Purpose of the Marathon**

The purpose of the MARATHON is to enable those who support and advocate for nonpublic education to make a public demonstration of their belief and involvement. Nonpublic schools and church religious education programs make a real contribution to the total community. Participants also raise funds in a "fun activity" for the nonpublic educational activity of their choice.



## **Participation in the Marathon**

The MARATHON for Nonpublic Education is for students, faculties, families, alumni and friends of nonpublic education. Nonpublic schools, Sunday schools, adult educational programs, faith formation programs and others participate by



MARATHON and organizing. Begin by appointing a MARATHON coordinator, set a goal, and involve your community.
